Methodology:

This poll was conducted between January 4-January 9, 2021 among a national sample of 1000 Health Care Workers. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Health Care Workers based on age, gender, and race. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
