Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted between August 2-August 6, 2021 among a sample of 1000 Mexican Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Mexican Adults based on age, gender, educational attainment, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
