Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted between March 16-March 17, 2022 among a sample of 1000 Brazilian Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Brazilian Adults based on age, gender, educational attainment, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
